One Heart Lent Program

The **One Heart Lent Program** is an effort to help feed hungry people in Lawrence through our Cor Unum Meal Center. **One Heart Lent Program** information sheets with Lent Jar wrappers are available at the welcome centers at the exits of the church. **In using this prayer guide, it is ideal to first read the Gospel passage cited next to the date, and then read the daily reflection.** It may be very helpful to keep daily notes on your reflections.

DAILY PRAYER GUIDE FOR THE FIRST WEEK OF LENT

Sunday, 3/15: John 4.5-42

In today's account from John 4, Jesus has an extended encounter with a Samaritan woman. The story might reflect various dimensions of our own personal encounters with Jesus today. There is mystery and revelation, a back-and-forth of questions and answers, increasing openness and trust, and eventually a significant spiritual movement on the part of the Samaritan woman. At any point in the encounter, the Samaritan woman is free to ignore Jesus, to not listen to His words, to dismiss Him, or to turn away from Him. She makes the free choice to remain engaged with Jesus, with all of the challenges this involves for her. At this point in Lent, if you are honestly trying to remain actively engaged with Jesus, you are on the right track spiritually! In your prayer today, speak directly with God about your intentions and spiritual goals for living each day of the week ahead. If you intend to engage deeply in Lent this week, read this prayer guide only one day at a time.

ALMSGIVING!

In many cases, the economically poor and hungry must beg in order to live. Your almsgiving through the **One Heart Lent Program** makes it possible for more people to be given the food they need – not to have to beg for it. This week, would you be willing to stand in for your hungry brothers and sisters by asking some of your family members, friends, neighbors, and coworkers to make contributions to your **One Heart Lent Program** jar? **Every dollar they contribute will provide one full meal at the Cor Unum Meal Center.** How many meals might you provide through your outreach this week?

Monday, 3/16: Luke 4.24-30

During Lent, we have said that our goal is to “repent and believe in the Gospel” – to turn away from sin and grow in faithfulness to the teaching of Jesus Christ. In this section of Luke 4, Jesus has just spoken to His neighbors in the synagogue in His hometown of Nazareth, offering them the revelation of who He is . . . not just their neighbor, but God's anointed one. After Jesus' neighbors question what He has said, He challenges their close-mindedness in not accepting that He is speaking God's truth. The neighbors respond with fury, attempting to kill Jesus. While this scene is somewhat unique and quite dramatic, what is fundamentally happening in it is that Jesus is inviting people to repent and believe in the Gospel. From the distance of 2000 years, we might be amazed at Jesus' neighbors' close-minded, furious rejection of His invitation. Are we equally amazed by our rejections of Jesus' invitations to repent and believe in the Gospel? Jesus speaks to us, through the power of the Holy Spirit, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week. Jesus speaks most directly through the teaching of the Church and the Scripture. In your prayer today, think of examples of how you have recently (perhaps during the past six months) heard one or another teaching of Jesus, but have not responded positively to it. You do not need to do any analysis of why you have not responded positively. Simply call to mind some examples. (If you have no examples, think some more.)

Tuesday, 3/17: Matthew 18.21-35

In this passage from Matthew 18, Jesus states absolutely clearly how often we must forgive people who sin against us: We must persist without any limitations in striving to forgive the people who sin against us. In the ultimate act of merciful love, Jesus Christ has sacrificed His entire life in order to forgive your sins – to make it possible for you to be reconciled with God now and eternally. Jesus has done this for every human being on planet earth. This is the fullness of love. If we make the decision to be disciples of Jesus, it means we must deny ourselves, take up our crosses daily, and follow Him (see your reflections from the second day of Lent) in putting true love into practice. Once you have grasped Jesus' teaching about the absolute obligation of His disciples to persist without any

limitations in striving to forgive the people who sin against you . . . every time you are faced with the choice of forgiving someone, it is an opportunity to grow as an authentic disciple of Jesus. Every choice to try to forgive, including the most difficult choice to forgive, is an opportunity to say “Yes” to Jesus, to grow in true love and freedom, and to progress along the path of salvation. In your prayer today, consider honestly whether you have heard this fundamental teaching of Jesus about forgiveness, and whether you sometimes (or often) do not respond positively. Why is that? You don’t need a therapist for this exercise. Just talk to God.

Wednesday, 3/18: Matthew 5.17-19

This text from Matthew 5 reminds us that Jesus reveals God’s truth to us in all dimensions of our life – in things that are “big”, and in things that are “small.” Being a Christian is not about neurotically obsessing over every tiny detail of life. It is, however, about letting the love of Jesus enter into and direct every part of our lives. The “small” areas of life should not be dismissed. When we choose to learn and put into practice the teaching of Jesus in “small” areas of our lives, these choices draw us closer to Jesus, reveal more to us the truth of who He is, expand the power of His love in and through us, and may open up new possibilities for growing in God’s truth in the “big” areas of our lives. Very often, we hear Jesus’ teaching about a particular area of life but dismiss it because we say it is too “small.” It is not possible to reconcile that dismissal with Jesus’ clear teaching in today’s Gospel reading. Today, reflect on ways that you hear Jesus’ teachings but dismiss them as too “small” for your attention and/or action. What is going on inside you when this takes place? Should you change in this area?

Thursday, 3/19: Luke 11.14-23

In this passage from Luke 11, Jesus has miraculously driven a demon out of a mute man, who afterwards is able to speak. Some people react to this miracle by accusing Jesus of casting out demons by the power of the Devil. Jesus takes seriously this accusation. He calmly, directly responds by explaining with clear reason why the accusation does not make sense. He also uses clear reason to suggest to his accusers that, in fact, the Kingdom of God has come to them through Him. The text does not report how Jesus’ accusers react to what He tells them. He has laid out the truth with clear reason. Will they open their minds to the truth? In our lives, we may hear teachings of Jesus to which we react negatively. Our faith tradition tells us that all of Jesus’ teachings, while they cannot be reduced to logical conclusions that automatically produce faith, have to make logical sense. For any significant teaching of Jesus, we are offered through the Church explanations that use clear reason to help us understand them. Sometimes, when we are offered the clear reason that can help us understand the teachings of Jesus, we reject it, refusing to listen to it or take it seriously. Very often, this is simply because we do not want to change. Can you think of examples of teachings of Jesus to which you react negatively, but about which you will not entertain the clear reason that helps you understand them? In such cases, why is it that you reject Jesus’ reaching out to you through clear reason?

Friday, 3/20: Mark 12.28-34

In today’s reading from Mark 12, Jesus tells a scribe that God’s first commandments are to love God with all of his being, and to love his neighbors as himself (as God loves us). No one currently living on this planet nearly completely loves God with all of himself/herself, and no one currently living on this planet nearly completely loves all other people as God loves us. Jesus must therefore be teaching us that this first, two-part commandment is a reality into which we grow, rather than a standard that we at some point achieve during our earthly lives. When the scribe in the passage responds to Jesus by affirming that He is right in what He has just said, the scribe is surely speaking honestly from the depth of his soul, because Jesus then gives the scribe the remarkable news: “You are not far from the Kingdom of God.” This means that the scribe is deeply on the path of salvation! For most of us, the process of maturing spiritually involves our recognizing various dimensions of our lives in which we are called by Jesus to change, but our hesitating or refusing to surrender those areas to the change to which Jesus calls us. We sometimes guard certain dimensions of ourselves as off-limits to Jesus. Amazingly (from 50,000 feet), the possibility of changing certain dimensions of who we are threatens us when, in fact, changing any and every dimension of our lives to conform to the love of Jesus is precisely what will fulfill us. Can you relate to this dynamic? What is going on?

Saturday, 3/21: Luke 18.9-14

If you have been engaged with the daily Gospel passages during this Third Week of Lent, you have probably reflected on some of your weaknesses and failings in being open to the ways that Jesus reaches into your life to lead you on the path of salvation. These reflections may not have been easy, and you may find it sobering to honestly recognize some of your limitations. Especially if the past week has been spiritually challenging for you, today’s parable from Luke 18 is very good news. In the parable, Jesus contrasts two men praying in the temple. The first man, while purportedly praying to God, is actually speaking to himself, listing his positive religious actions but doing absolutely nothing (not even praying) for the tax collector next to him, whom he judges to be a serious sinner. The second man, the tax collector, speaks directly to God, honestly acknowledges his sin, expresses sincere repentance, and asks God for mercy. Jesus states that the first man is not justified . . . not in a proper relationship with God . . . but the second man is justified . . . in a proper relationship with God. At the end of this Third Week of Lent, to which man can you more relate – the first, or the second? If it is the second, count yourself blessed! Spend some time today reflecting closely on this passage, and speak directly with God about where you stand with Him at this point in Lent.

FLU PREVENTION

Flu activity remains high in Massachusetts. This year, there is a novel coronavirus, COVID-19, which is thought to have similar characteristics to the flu.

There are some things that we can do to prevent getting both viruses:

- Wash your hands with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based hand gel that is at least 60% alcohol.
- Cough or sneeze into a tissue or, if you do not have tissues, into the inside of your elbow. Throw used tissues away and wash your hands after using them.
- Avoid close, physical contact with people who are sick. Try to stay three to six feet away from anyone with the flu.
- Stay home from work, school and other activities if you are sick with a flu-like illness (fever with cough or sore throat). Stay home until you have not had a fever for at least 24 hours, usually about four days. You can take Tylenol, Advil or Motrin to lower your fever. You should stay home when you are taking those medicines to keep your fever low.
