ASH WEDNESDAY COLLECTION

The single collection at Ash Wednesday Masses is to help support Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Boston.

LENTEN REGULATIONS ON ABSTINENCE AND FASTING

Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of **fasting** and **abstinence**.

Fridays of Lent are also days of **abstinence**.

Fasting: Catholics over 18 years of age who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday are bound to the obligation of fasting. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence: Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, speak with one of our priests

One Heart Lent Program

The One Heart Lent Program is an effort to help feed hungry people in Lawrence through our Cor Unum Meal Center. One Heart Lent Program information sheets with Lent Jar wrappers are available at the welcome centers at the exits of the church. In using this prayer guide, it is ideal to first read the Gospel passage cited next to the date, and then read the daily reflection. It may be very helpful to keep daily notes on your reflections.

DAILY PRAYER GUIDE FOR THE BEGINNING OF LENT

Wednesday, 2/26 (Ash Wednesday): Matthew 6.1-6, 16-18

On April 9, we will enter into the holiest days of 2020 – the Easter Triduum. Through the Easter Triduum, God will offer to draw us into the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the one and only Savior of the world . . . so that the reality of salvation may somehow be renewed within us and in the world. Lent is the period of spiritual preparation for the grace of the Easter Triduum. The goal of Lent is to grow during the next six weeks as maximally authentic disciples of Jesus Christ. We do this by, one day at a time, turning away from sin and becoming more faithful to the Gospel. Six weeks, if lived casually, pass in a flash. Six weeks, if lived with an intense spiritual focus, is a long period of time. If you want to actively live Lent 2020, it is important that you begin with a clear understanding of your intentions for this season. Spend some time today reflecting on how you intend to live the upcoming six weeks. Is it your intention to take each day seriously, and to put in whatever effort is needed to grow as an authentic disciple of Jesus? What are your other intentions as you enter into Lent? In your prayer time today, speak directly to God about your intentions for Lent 2020. Ask for whatever graces you think you may need to help you pursue your spiritual plans. It might be a good idea to make some notes for yourself about the content of your reflection and prayer today. Those notes might be helpful to you later in Lent.

ALMSGIVING!

To begin Lent, put a **One Heart Lent Program** wrapper on an empty jar. Place your jar in a location that is very visible to you, and each day during Lent place in it an amount of money that will be a reasonable daily sacrifice for you. Your sacrifice will help feed some of the neediest of our brothers and sisters through the Cor Unum Meal Center. **Every dollar you contribute will provide one full meal at the Cor Unum Meal Center.**

Thursday, 2/27: Luke 9.22-25

Hopefully, you yesterday made the free choice to live this Lent trying to grow as an authentic disciple of Jesus Christ. If that's the case, take today's straightforward teaching from Jesus as a big gift to you. In this passage from Luke 9, Jesus teaches that there are three requirements for anyone who is trying to grow as His authentic disciple. First, you must deny yourself. That means you must put Jesus at the center of your life, rather than yourself, someone else, or anything else. Jesus speaks to us 24/7, most directly through the teaching of the Church and the scripture. To be an authentic disciple, you must freely choose to put Jesus . . . and everything He teaches . . . at the center of your life. Second, you must take up your cross daily, which means accepting whatever passion, difficulties, and challenges are involved in putting into practice the teaching of Jesus. Third, you must persist in following him, continually working to put into practice His teaching. Here's the big question for this second day of Lent: For the next six weeks, are you willing to accept Jesus' teaching in this passage and freely choose to do what He says is necessary to grow as His authentic disciple? Are you willing to (1) deny yourself, (2) take up your cross daily, and (3) persist in following Him through each day? Reflect on this question today, and in your prayer time speak directly to Jesus about it. If you are willing to commit yourself to entering into these three requirements of authentic discipleship, make that commitment directly to Jesus. If you honestly are not willing to make that commitment, reflect some more.

Friday, 2/28: Matthew 9.14-15

In today's reading from Matthew 9, Jesus affirms the value of the spiritual discipline of fasting: to bridge some of the gap between God and us. (When Jesus says that His disciples who are with Him during His earthly ministry do not need to fast while He is physically with them, He offers His immediate listeners a clue about who He is. If there is no gap between God and Jesus' original disciples . . . Jesus must be God.) This Lent, you are invited to fast – to freely sacrifice some of the food and drink that you would otherwise consume – in order to help bridge the gap between God and you. The Church's official regulations for Lenten fasting and abstinence are minimal (two days of moderate fasting and seven Fridays of abstinence from meat). Today, consider and finalize the additional elements of fasting you intend to observe during Lent. Your fasting should be reasonable, doable, and never an end in itself. You will know that your fasting is spiritually healthy if, over the next few weeks, it fosters your prayer, increases your sacrificial love for other people, and deepens your solidarity for people in need. If, in a few weeks, your particular fasting practices are not spiritually productive (or prove to be ends in themselves), plan to switch up your fasting practices.

Saturday, 2/29: Luke 5.27-32

In today's text from Luke 5, when some are scandalized by Jesus' intimate association with people who are sinful, Jesus is clear about His mission: "Those who are healthy do not need a physician, but the sick do. I have not come to call the righteous to repentance but sinners." Jesus, the eternal Son of God, becomes a fully human being in order to offer salvation to our fallen, sinful world. He does this by entering directly into the lives of sinful people and offering them . . . Himself. If a person responds to Jesus' offer of Himself by letting Him in, listening to Him, and choosing to live as His disciple, that person accepts the offer of salvation. In your prayer today, envision Jesus' walking into your house, recognizing you as a sinner, and inviting you to accept His offer of salvation through a relationship with Him at the center of your life. To what extent do you understand yourself as a sinner? How do you react to Jesus' (complete) knowledge of your sin? How do you respond to His offer to enter directly into your sinful life to share with you His mercy and lead you to a new path of holiness? If you can, speak directly to Jesus about His offer.

Otras dos comidas sin carne están permitidas para mantener la fuerza y pueden ser consumidas de acuerdo a las necesidades de la persona, pero juntas no deben igualar una comida completa.
